Football Manager Stole My Life lifts the lid on the cult of Football Manager (FM). It is an easy-to-read, highly illustrated, light-hearted guide to the game's lasting impact on popular culture.

We hear from the gamers whose lives have been taken over by FM, a game cited in 35 divorce cases in the UK. There are interviews with the players who become world beaters in the game, but in real life never make the big leagues.

The incredible scouting network of Sports Interactive is revealed. We speak to the men who make the game, and put an FM addict on the psychologists couch to discover what 20 years as a virtual football manager has done to him.

This is a superb book, witty and very funny as well as informative. It sends me down memory lane, a trip from which I never want to return. Don't bring me Sergio Agüero, bring me David Collins and Tonton Zola Moukoko.... This is exactly what this book does. badly missed. The sympathy of all Club Officials and members goes to John's family at this difficult time.

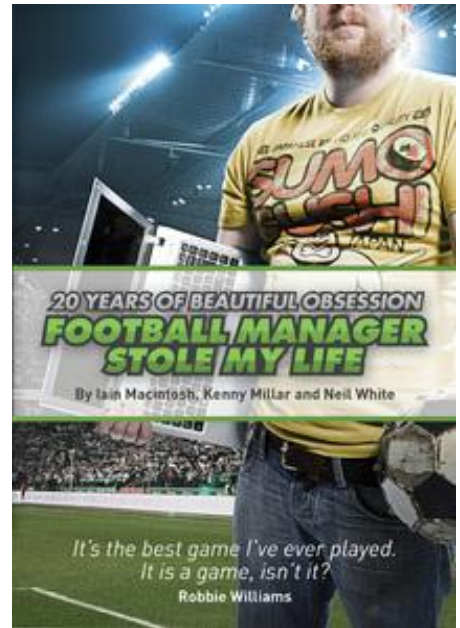

## Walters to manage Young Wingmakers

STEVE Walters has been appointed to manage the Wingmakers' highly-successful Under-19 squad, who won the Welsh Premier Under-19 league title last season.

"I'd like to welcome Steve to Airbus, he is just the type of character to ensure the good work of Lee Starkey and Steve Benyon moves on to the next level, hopefully getting a number of our talented youngsters through to first team level and beyond," says chief operating officer Stewart Roberts.

"Steve will work closely with Andy Preece and the management team as we look to reinforce in all the right areas."



Walters began his playing career with Crewe Alexandra and made his debut aged 16 years and 119 days on 6 May 1989 against Peterborough United.

Through the early part of the 1990s he built up 173 appearances for the club in all competitions, also scoring 11 goals.

This included an appearance in the 1993 Football League Third Division play-off final, which Alex lost on penalties to York City, though they gained automatic promotion a year later.

Walters dropped out of League football in 1995, aged only 23, and joined Northwich Victoria where he spent five years.

He then signed with Morecambe, where he spent one season, moving on to Stevenage Borough and then Kidsgrove Athletic.

In 2002, Walters signed for Rhyl and scored eight goals from 53 (+3) Welsh Premier appearances during two seasons at Belle Vue and was a key member of the squad that won the domestic treble in 2003/4.

He later went on to manager Rhos Aelwyd in the Cymru Alliance.

"I'd like to thank Airbus for giving me the opportunity to join an ambitious, up and coming club during these exciting times," says Walters.

"It will be a privilege to work under Andy Preece and Andy Morrison, who are doing a fantastic job.

"I can't wait to return to football, helping the youngsters to improve and hopefully into the first team."

# Robins Chairman translates ideas into plans

Newtown AFC Chairman, Elwyn Preece (pictured) received the fruits of his ideas this week when ardent club supporter, Richard Lewis, an Architect with local firm, Doug Hughes Architects, produced plans based on Elwyn's ideas to develop the last side of the ground which will take the stadium to UEFA Category 2 standard.



The proposal is that the roadway around the ground behind the top goal, is removed, along with the bank and treeline between the ground and the small car park, with vehicular entry to the ground gained through the car park, and down a new road joining up with the existing in front of the Keith Harding large stand.

The plans are designed to fit in with the FAW's offer to provide assistance to the Club in reaching Category 2 Stadium accreditation and will feature additional seating to exceed the required 1500 seats necessary, new changing rooms, drug-testing rooms, First Aid and Referee and delegate rooms.

Newtown Officials are scheduled to meet with FAW Licensing Officers this week to analyse the Stadium deficiencies to meet the higher Category 2 level, where the plans will be presented to them for advice and any additional requirements.
