# An incredible history that all in Wales should be proud of

Next Monday we celebrate the 126<sup>th</sup> FAW Welsh Cup Final. This is the third oldest national cup competition in the world. Yes the world!

Only the FA Cup (1871) and the Scottish Cup (1873) are older than what Prestatyn Town and Bangor City are competing for today. It was way back in 1877/88 that Wrexham beat the Druids to claim the first title, but regrettably for the winning captain that day, there was no trophy to lift. Were local bragging rights simply enough back then? Author Phil Stead clarifies the trophy's beginnings in his book; *'The Red Dragons: The Story of Welsh Football'*.

"The first Welsh Cup competition was played without a trophy. Donations were requested and the names of the rich gentlemen who donated were published weekly on the front page of the Wrexham Guardian. By 1877, a trophy was commissioned from a London silversmith, J.W. Benson, of Old Bond Street, London. This is the trophy that is still used today, and is recognised as the second oldest football trophy in the world, after the Scottish Cup. On the top of the trophy you can see the arms of Ruabon. The trophy has two metal plates which were intended as inscription beds for the

winners in 1877 and 1878, as the silversmith could have had no idea that the trophy would still be played for over 130 years later."

It is for these historical reasons that in my opinion, the Welsh Cup final should be the highlight of the Welsh footballing calendar. It saddens me to think that increasingly history matters for little in the global and commercial world of football that we now live in. Indeed, when Swansea City won the Capital One Cup this season, journalists chose to discard their previous successes in this competition by claiming that it was the Swans' first ever cup success. The Premier League and the Champions League are new products that are instantly recognisable throughout the world. They are products that are more recognisable and cherished than even than the oldest cup competition in the world. The FA Cup now lives in these shadows and that is emphasised by the 5:15 kick-off time next week, which severely restricts the return transport of the fans attending from the north, but clearly more importantly, the match doesn't clash with the Premier League matches that day.

I revert back to Stead's book and specifically back to that first final in 1877 as today owes a lot to the FA Cup;

"The English FA Cup had begun six years earlier, but Wales had only just played their first international match. There was no Football League, and only friendlies were played in Wales. Thus the Welsh Football Association Challenge Cup was one of the foremost competitions of the time. It was felt that the national team players with Welsh clubs needed serious competitive fixtures if they were to compete with England and Scotland."

"The first Welsh Cup competition was proposed in 1877 by (FAW Secretary) Llewelyn Kenrick, who had played for Shropshire Wanderers in the semi-final of English version. The competition was open to the clubs of Wales and the border counties of England, which may seem illogical, but remember that individuals at Oswestry and Shrewsbury were prominent in the development of the game in Wales, and the border clubs were considered FAW members. "

"Wrexham hosted the first final at Acton Park, which in those days was a country manor house and the 17<sup>th</sup> century home of the (in)famous Judge Jeffries. A patch of grass was allocated in the grounds, and 1,500 fans paid 2 ½ pence each to watch the game. Wrexham faced Druids, and won by a goal to nil;" confirmed Stead. Druids had insisted on a neutral venue so the match could not be held at the Racecourse. The winning goal was scored in the last minute, rushed through by James Davies who was later FAW president.

So next Monday we are back in Wrexham some 135 years later, the Racecourse is not exactly a country manor house and our spectators will have paid a little more than 2 ½ pence, but Monday's two teams will compete as equally fierce and as equally as determined to be crowned Welsh Cup winners.

The competition has a history that competitions worldwide could only dream of and for that we should be proud. And for that we should continue to support and re-build this competition to make it a significant event on the Welsh footballing calendar once more.

# Mulliner enters Hall of Fame

Andy Mulliner, the most experienced goalkeeper in Welsh Premier League history is the next member of the Hall of Fame. Mulliner started his career in the league with Llansantffraid and played over 200 games for the club between 1993 and 1999. His greatest moment for Llansantffraid came at the Arms Park in 1996, saving the crucial penalty to win the Welsh Cup against Barry Town.

In 2000, he won the Welsh Cup again, with Bangor City.

Mulliner went on to play for Aberystwyth, Connah's Quay, Newtown, Caersws and Welshpool and in 2006, he became only the third player to play 400 games in the league.

He left the league in 2009 and put away the gloves to retire, but returned to the league two years later, aged over 40, to help and injury-hit Airbus, which means that Mulliner has made more appearances in the league than any other goalkeeper by a margin of over one hundred and fifty.

# Morgan gets the whistle for Cup Final

Kevin Morgan from Cardiff has been appointed as the referee for the 126th Welsh Cup Final between Bangor City and Prestatyn Town, which will also be his final match as a referee.

Morgan received the news two weeks ago from the FAW and said; "I am honoured and absolutely delighted to have been appointed to the Welsh Cup Final. It will be the perfect way to finish my career as a referee, it's fantastic news."

Morgan, who originates from Llanelli, is a former player who took up refereeing after injury curtailed his playing career younger than he had hoped, but it's an accident that actually worked out well for him.

"My only regret from football is that I didn't get injured earlier, which would have meant that I would have got into refereeing earlier;" said Morgan.

"I was playing for Porth Tywyn, ironically in the Welsh Cup, against Caerleon in 1996. I even remember the date, it was October 24th. I was badly injured and that was the end of my playing career so it's fitting that I should end my refereeing career in the same competition, I'm obviously very glad that this is on my terms though."

Morgan then took up refereeing in September 1998 and quickly made his way up to the top. He took charge of his first FAW Final in the Regions Cup at Ninian Park in May 2008, then the following season, he took charge of the FAW Trophy Final.





He was also in the middle for the FAW Youth Cup Final at the Liberty Stadium in May 2010, meaning three National Finals in as many years.

He was then appointed as the referee for the inaugural Welsh Premier League Play-Off Final between Neath and Prestatyn at the Gnoll in May 2011, which he rates as his hardest game in the middle. "That play-off final was tough. There was so much riding on it for both clubs, with a first place in Europe for both clubs at stake and I remember that it was on edge."

Morgan refereed his final Welsh Premier League match at Connah's Quay last Saturday against Newtown and the players stood in a guard of honour for him.

Kevin will be assisted by Wrexham's Phil Roszkowski and Abergele's Gwyn Vaughan at the Final on Monday 6th May at the Racecourse in Wrexham. His 4th official will be Richard Harrington from Aberdare.

## Reformed Reds would drop three rungs

LLANELLI AFC have been warned they will have to start from the depths of MacWhirter Welsh League Division Three if they are allowed to reform after being wound up this week.

The financially ravaged Reds were put out of business at London's High Court on Monday, over a £21,000 tax debt which was only a part of the club's total debts of around £140,000.

Llanelli had already been refused a licence to play in the Welsh Premier League next season and, even if they were to form a new club over the summer, they would have to begin in the fourth tier of Welsh football.

But not even their place in Division Three is guaranteed, as the Football Association of Wales will have to approve the newly-founded club before it can be entered into the Welsh league pyramid.

If Llanelli do begin next season in Division Three, the lowly status of their opponents will give them a sobering reminder of their plight.

Risca United, Tredegar Town and Abertillery Bluebirds will be among the teams the Reds will be able to look forward to facing in the fourth tier — a far cry from the European teams they confronted in the Europa League and Champions League qualifiers in recent seasons.

There were faint hopes Llanelli would have been allowed to enter Division One, but the Welsh Football League has ruled out such a scenario. "As far as we are concerned, there is no process for clubs to follow other than the current promotion and relegation structure we use," said the league's secretary Ken Tucker.

"We would love to see Llanelli, such a historic club, survive but we cannot just put them straight into our top division.

"It is up to the FAW whether Llanelli are allowed back in the Welsh League and, if they are, they would have to start in Division Three.

"Llanelli's big problem is getting let into the league by the FAW. If that's the case, they won't be any higher than Division Three."

If a reformed Llanelli side do enter the Welsh Football League at its lowest level, club legend Wyndham Evans believes the Reds could rise again with new-found strength.

"It was very sad to see Llanelli wound up," said the former Reds player and manager. For a club with more than 100 years of history, it's a terrible shame that financial issues should force the club out of business.

"The best — and the only — way forward for Llanelli is to follow the lead of Swansea, Portsmouth and others and to get the fans on board to help run the club.

"If they have to start from the bottom of the Welsh League, at least they'll have local players who will be proud to play, a local team who will attract bigger crowds and appeal to the town."
