Loanees offered new deals



Two players who spent the 2012/13 season helping their loan clubs reach Europe have been offered new deals by their parent club Wrexham. Wrexham player-manager Andy Morrell has offered new contracts to defenders Anthony Stephens (in red, left) and Steve Tomassen. Stephens helped Prestatyn win a first Welsh Cup in their 103-year history and with it Europa League qualification for the first time.

Tomassen made such an impression at the Airfield for Andy Preece's Airbus UK, that he captained the Wingmakers at times as the Broughton-based side finished in a record second-position to claim European football for

the first time.

It remains to be seen whether either will be offered out on loan next season and able to play in the Europa League, which starts on Thursday 4th July.

Meanwhile Airbus UK's Lee Owens is also attracting the attention of Morrell after consistent displays this season.

Brownhill departs Citizens

Bangor City defender Liam Brownhill has left the club and announced his decision on twitter:

Barry deserve more than a footnote in history

One of Wales' most famous and most successful domestic clubs have been effectively reduced to a footnote on the Welsh Football League's website.

On Monday night, the management committee of the south Wales based league met to discuss the withdrawal of Barry Town by their controversial owner, Stuart Lovering.

With just two games remaining, both against Ton Pentre, Lovering had given notice he was pulling the club out of the league ... but why, I hear you ask.

Unfortunately, that question seems destined never to be answered.

No statement was released to the press, no mention has been made on the Welsh Football League's own website, apart from a footnote to the League's list of tables which reads "Barry Town have withdrawn from Division One – record expunged".

It's a sad indictment that a club with such a proud past and such a promising future have been reduced to a footnote on the Welsh League's website.

Having reached the Welsh Cup semi finals, losing to eventual winners, Prestatyn Town, Barry Town are a club bouncing back hoping to recapture some of the glory days of the 1990s.

And it's been a long and winding road back for the seven time Welsh Premier League champions.

In 2003, with mounting debts and facing administration, the club lost the majority of its players and backroom staff.

And it was under this financial black cloud which Lovering arrived, buying the club and presiding over its relegation from the Welsh Premier League to the Welsh League Second Division.

Having been unsuccessful in his many bids to sell the club for a grossly inflated price, Lovering then set about making life as difficult as possible for his own club's managers, players and supporters.

In 2004, with rent going unpaid to the Vale of Glamorgan Council, and despite the fans paying part of the club's debt, Lovering opted not to settle the debt but to move the club 20 miles away to Treforest.

Despite returning to Jenner Park in 2006, the fans' only contact with their club's owner came as he either reduced playing budgets, sacked managers or banned supporters from Jenner Park.

But throughout the chaos Gavin Chesterfield succeeded in securing promotion from the Second Division.

Following yet more threats from Lovering to pull the plug on the club unless he found a buyer for the club, the Barry Town Supporters' Committee was formed in January 2009.

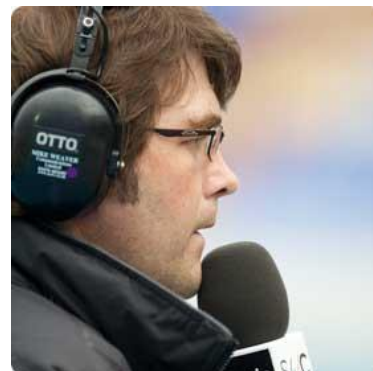
Taking responsibility for all footballing matters, the BTSC – a non-profit organisation – reached agreement with the council for the use of Jenner Park and set about raising money to pay for the team.

The rebuilding of Barry Town under Chesterfield and the Supporters' Committee has been one of Welsh domestic football's success stories in recent seasons.

With two successful Welsh Cup runs under their belt which saw their vociferous and colourful fans making a welcome return to grounds the length and breadth of Wales, the club turned its attentions to an ascent back to the Welsh Premier League.

But Lovering's meddling refused to go away.

Despite apparently promising to keep out of the club's footballing matters he installed himself as club secretary and finally carried out the threat he had held over Barry Town since his arrival.



The latest news to be confirmed is that a revamped club is hoping to be admitted to the Welsh League for the forthcoming season. It will be run by the BTSC co-operative as previously and be known as **BARRY TOWN UNITED.**

Consortium in bid for Llanelli AFC

A CONSORTIUM of town businessmen are believed to have put in a bid to revive the wound-up Llanelli AFC.

A group of four Llanelli men, whose identities are currently shrouded in secrecy, have put in a bid for the lease of Stebonheath Park and the running of the social club.

They have also applied to the FAW to be accepted into Welsh League Division Three for next season, according to Kevin Tucker, chairman of the Reds Action Group.

The 52-year-old said the supporters' group had shelved their own plans to bring the club back to life in order for the consortium to make progress, but has now appealed for reassurance on whether they have the "right intentions".

Mr Tucker said: "We set up our group to hopefully set up a supporters' trust, which would then make Llanelli FC a community owned operative structure.

"But it came to light from Bob Jeffrey (former Reds manager) that there was a consortium involving four people who have put a bid in. He asked whether the supporters could liaise with them, rather than put our own bid in.

"We held a meeting between us last week and voted to back the consortium as we did not want to jeopardise their plans by putting our own bid in and both bids going against each other.

"The main objective is to have a football club next season, and we have sent a letter of support to the FAW and the town council to support the consortium's plans."

At London's High Court, Registrar Derrett lost patience with the debt-ridden Reds and pulled the curtain down on their 117-year-history last month, formally winding the club up over a £21,000 tax debt — a figure the club maintains is largely not due.

Mr Tucker, who had watched the Reds intermittently with his dad since the 1970s, said the group would be pursuing further information from the consortium on their visions for the future.

"From what we believe they have got the right intentions, but it is shrouded in secrecy at the moment. If their intentions are fully honourable, hopefully we can get back through the Welsh leagues and even further in future years," he said.

"If we don't receive the assurances, we will be looking at putting a survey out to see if there is enough support to have a co-operative structure.

"We are 100 per cent behind the plans, but we need to know what is going on. If it is not forthcoming we will have to put the feelers out for our plans.

"I would like to appeal for them to come forward and share their plans with us. We have hung back after hearing their bid, but we need to find out what their intentions are."

He added that the supporters' group had held talks with Supporters Direct, a group which worked closely with Aldershot Town and Portsmouth FC when they had their own troubles.

Mr Tucker added: "The long term intention is to have a supporter-run club and we don't want to have to rely on one person as we have done in the past.

"Our intentions are for the social club to be run to support the football club — if they don't go hand in hand there is no point in running the football club.

"We want the town and the community to have a major say in what is happening. We can't go back to the way it was."

The name of the new club has yet to be decided. The original club logo is featured above.

Cardiff City Ladies take title on last day



Cardiff City FC claimed the inaugural Welsh Premier Women's League title as they beat a gallant Wrexham side at the Cardiff City Stadium on Sunday. Before the match started they had a 14 goal advantage over closest rivals Cardiff Met who were hosting Llandudno Junction at the same time. Rachel Rowe calmed the nerves of the home supporters after 24 minutes as she opened the scoring and two further impressive strikes by Danielle Broadhurst before the break put the home side firmly in the driving seat. Regular updates were fed from the Met game – and it became clear

midway through the second half that the Students were not going to claw back the required goals to clinch the title themselves on goal difference. This allowed Cardiff City to relax a little – and their defence relaxed a little too much just before the hour mark as Lowri Edwards netted for the visitors. After 76 minutes of play, substitute Alicia Davies set up a simple tap in for Siobhan Walsh but two minutes later Kate Edwards replied impressively for Wrexham. Davies herself - sealed the victory and the title for her side with two minutes left as she calmly slotted her side's 5th goal of the game past Rosie Lamprey. Congratulations to Cardiff City – they only lost one game all season. Commiserations in equal measures to Cardiff Met who were left rueing their only league defeat of the season against the newly crowned Champions.

Owens scoops the awards at Airbus

LEE Owens scooped three awards at Airbus UK Broughton's annual presentation night.

The 26-year-old full back was voted supporters', managers' and players' player of the season.
