

Top six race now down to rulebook....



Gap Connah's Quay has been found guilty by a Football Association of Wales Disciplinary Panel of fielding an ineligible player.

The Panel decided to deduct the club one Corbett Sports Welsh Premier League points and fine them £250 for fielding Lee Davey as a late substitute in the league match against Carmarthen Town on the 5th of January. Davey had previously played for Colwyn Bay FC and Conwy Borough FC during the present season and while he was entitled to register for Gap Connah's Quay – participating for three teams in one season is not permitted.

Gap Connah's Quay has seven business days in which to appeal the decision. The club is perfectly within its rights to appeal the decision.

The Corbett Sports Welsh Premier League is aware that this may impact the beginning of the Second Phase of the Corbett Sports Welsh Premier League.

With the Second Phase due to start this coming weekend it means that only two matches in each of the Championship and Play-off Conferences will take place.

A spokesperson for Gap Connah's Quay commented on Saturday evening

"We apologise for any disruption that might occur to our colleagues as we take our right to appeal. We believe we are innocent of the charge brought against us by the FAW.

"We are taking this fight forward and hope you will appreciate that we will avail of our right to appeal until no appeal process is left open to us. Unfortunately this may take some time."

New Signings

Airbus UK Broughton were happy to hear last week that Wrexham loanee **Steve Tomassen**, who was recalled to the Racecourse at the start of the month has had his loan agreement renewed.

The Wingmakers have swooped for highly-experienced ex-Football League midfielder **Jason Jarrett** who arrives from Halifax Town after making 296 appearances in league and cup competitions in a 13-year career in the Football League.

The 33-year-old started his career with Blackpool in 1998, later moving to Wrexham and then spent two seasons with Bury, where he became a first team regular and avoided relegation to the Third Division by making a £75,000 move to Wigan Athletic in Division One.

After recovering from a broken leg, he spent January 2005 on-loan with Stoke City and played three games for the Potters, including their 2-1 FA Cup defeat to Arsenal.

Manager Tony Pulis was reported to be eager to have him back at the Britannia Stadium but nothing came of the talk and Jarrett remained at the JJB Stadium, leaving after rejecting a new deal to move to Nigel Worthington's Norwich City in June 2005.

After playing just 11 league games for the Canaries, he was loaned to Plymouth Argyle before joining Preston North End in a £30,000 loan deal that later became permanent.

Jarrett had loan spells with Hull City and Leicester City and, after being transfer-listed by Norwich, had loan spells at QPR and Oldham.

He then moved to Brighton & Hove Albion, following his manager Micky Adams to Port Vale in September 2009, but the move proved unsuccessful and he rejoined Oldham on a permanent move.

Released in January 2011, Jarrett joined Halifax last July.

"We are pleased to welcome Jason to the Hollingsworth Group Stadium," says chief operating officer Stewart Roberts.

"His experience is sure to be a great asset as the club bids to strengthen its position in the Championship Conference during the second phase of the season and he is likely to conclude our transfer business in the January window."

Tommy Holmes has been released from the Hollingsworth Group Stadium by mutual consent.

The 33-year-old signed for the Wingmakers in the 2011 close season after spending 11 seasons with TNS, where he won numerous honours and made 17 European appearances, a total bettered by only eight Welsh Premier players.

A regular in the TNS back line after arriving from Tranmere Rovers in 2000/1, he made 267 league appearances and was voted Welsh Premier player of the month in February 2009. Since joining Airbus, he has added another 18 (+3) appearances.

"Tommy has been terrific for us and not once a problem despite not featuring much this term," says Airbus chief operating officer Stewart Roberts. "Numerous clubs are interested in Tosh and we felt it only fair he is allowed to choose his next club rather than loan him for a period of time.

Dylan Blain became the sixth signing of Bob Jeffrey's eventful **Llanelli** managerial career last night after making his first team debut in the 2-1 defeat against Swansea City in torrential rain at Stebonheath Park.

Whitland born Dylan started his career at Haverfordwest County, playing 167 Welsh Premier League games and scoring nine goals, before moving to Port Talbot Town in 2006, staying for two seasons and playing 57 league games, scoring eight goals. Dylan then moved to Newtown for two seasons playing 63 league games with a return of five league goals, before a move back to Port Talbot brought 44 league outings and two goals. This included sixteen league appearances this season, fifteen minutes against the Reds in the season's opener at the GenQuip Stadium and a full 90 minutes in the live game at Stebo.

Dylan will strengthen the Llanelli midfield and bring much needed experience to the new look Reds side.

Jordan Smith a former Cardiff City and Swansea City Academy product has agreed to join the Reds from Haverfordwest County. Capped by Wales at Under 17 & Under 19 level under Brian Flynn, he joined Swansea City in 2009 after a spell with Cardiff City. The central midfielder player then spent two years under Tony Pennock's guidance at the Liberty Stadium, playing 12 games last season in the Premier Reserve League against the likes of Arsenal, Newcastle and Chelsea before joining Haverfordwest County last summer to gain first team experience. Jordan aged 19 will be looking to play a central role in midfield in Bob Jeffrey's new look side and build on the promise he has shown so far in his career, with Stebonheath being the ideal platform to establish his ball playing ability on the Welsh Premier League scene.

Jeff White became Jeffrey's eighth signing of the transfer window, with just over 24 hours to go. White, 27, will provide the Reds with more fire-power upfront following the loss of Martin Rose and Luke Bowen to Port Talbot and Port Melbourne Sharks respectively.

He joined Port Talbot at the start of the season, moving from Welsh League Division Three side Bridgend Street and has played 20 Welsh Premier games this season, finding the net on seven occasions, proving to be an excellent target man at Welsh Premier level. He previously played for Rhoose FC in the South Wales Amateur League as well as representing the South Wales FA. He has come to the Welsh Premier League midway through his career but will be determined to build on the excellent progress he has made at Port Talbot Town this season by firing the goals for the Reds.

Jack McKenna became the next signing for Llanelli Manager Bob.

The 21 year-old Bristol born winger, has signed for the Reds from Clevedon Town, with his transfer subject to gaining International Clearance from the Football Association.

Jack started his career at Swindon Town, winning the Milk Youth Cup before moving to Bristol Rovers, where he progressed through the youth ranks, breaking into the first team squad for 2009-10 under the management of ex-Welsh International Paul Trollope. The following season Jack spent a two month loan spell with Chippenham Town before leaving the Pirates to join Frome Town.

He then had a spell in Bristol with Bristol Manor Farm, before joining Clevedon Town in the Southern League Division One, but a badly broken wrist requiring surgery, led to Jack having a long spell out of the game.

Jack has represented English Colleges and is currently a student at Swansea University studying Financial Economics. He made his Reds debut in Tuesday nights friendly with Swansea City, but unfortunately suffered an injury during the first half. He is expected to be fit for the next Welsh Premier game though.

Daniel Barnard was the tenth and final signing for Bob Jeffrey in the final hour of the transfer window. Nineteen year-old Dan started his career at Cheltenham Town, progressing through their academy before joining his local side Monmouth Town two seasons ago and playing his part in their march through Welsh League Divisions Three and Two.

Abergavenny born, Dan can play at anywhere across the back four and trained for the Reds during September after being spotted by former Assistant Manager Stephen Jenkins playing for Monmouth last season. Dan is a good reader of the game and his strength belies his frame.

He spent pre-season training with Hereford United but on achieving good A Level results in August decided wisely to put his education before football and started a Degree at Swansea University in October.

After settling into student life, Dan is now ready to continue his career on the football field and where better than Stebo to develop his game away from the lecture theatre.

Gap Connah's Quay are pleased to announce the signing of twenty year-old forward **Sean Breen** from Chorley Town. Sean was a regular scorer in the Morecambe Reserve set up before leaving last autumn.

We hope Wirral based Sean will form a pacey and lively front duo with Michael Hayes for the second phase of the WPL season. He is registered in time to make a debut at Bala this Saturday.

Afan Lido's January transfer window signings continued last week with three new signings.

Following the signing of midfielder Adam James (Kristian James brother) on Monday, Thursday saw the announcement of another two signings.

Defender Mark Crutch signs from Bridgend and striker Simon Prangle joins from Taffs Well. Simon was Welsh League Division 1's 4th top scorer with 11 league goals this season.

But leaving the Lido is newly signed Craig Jones who is leaving to go to Australia.

Bala Town were last week delighted to announce that 25 year-old shot stopper Michael Platt has joined their ranks.

Platt joins the Lakesiders from Penycae where he has spent a season and a half and was also named in last season's Huws Gray Alliance Team of the Year. The 6ft 3" keeper has also appeared for Gresford Athletic, Caernarfon Town and Llay Welfare. Mike will wear the number 30 shirt.

Also new to the squad is Edwin Renaud. The Liverpool born midfielder arrived from Quarry Bank Old Boys from the Liverpool County Premier League. Edwin will wear the number 14 shirt.

Jordan Follows has turned down an approach from Carmarthen Town and decided to stay on at **Aberystwyth Town**

Prestatyn Town manager Neil Gibson has brought in two players just before the window closed, with one new face arriving as well as a former favourite returning to Bastion Road.

Former Bangor City striker **Mark Smyth** signed for the Seasiders on Thursday morning to become the first capture of the transfer window.

Smyth made one Carling Cup appearance for Liverpool against Tottenham but was released from Anfield in 2005 and played for Accrington Stanley and Vauxhall Motors, signing for Bangor in December 2006.

He left to join former manager Steve Bleasdale at Leigh RMI in October 2007, returning to Farrar Road briefly for the Uefa Cup campaign in July the following year.

After a further spell with Leigh he was back at Farrar Road in November 2010 and he scored 23 goals in the WPL from 54 (+40) appearances.

Returning to the club is **Jon Fisher-Cooke** to help Gibson's push for Europe. The club wrote that he went into semi-retirement last year but has re-signed as striking cover and will be a welcome addition to the Seasiders squad.

The frontman, who has made a total of 57 (+53) appearances in the Welsh Premier, netting 18 times, has also worn the colours of Rhyl, Flexys Cefn Druids, Colwyn Bay and Denbigh Town and is a former Welsh Schoolboys international.

"He will perhaps be best and most fondly remembered by Town fans for netting the goals that clinched us the Welsh Alliance League title in 2005/6;" concluded the statement.

The New Saints have completed the signing of **Jamie Mullan**.

Mullan, who plays as an attacking winger has joined the Welsh Champions from Conference North side, Stalybridge.

The 24 year old former Manchester United junior, has expressed his delight at joining the Oswestry based club.

The Nottingham-born Mullan, spent four years with Manchester United's academy after joining from Notts County as a 14-year-old.

After leaving Old Trafford he moved on to Rochdale for a short spell before switching to Northwich Victoria in January 2008, where he won the young player of the year award after helping them stave off relegation. In May 2009 he joined Fleetwood Town where he was a member of the 2009/2010 promotion winning squad and made over 30 appearances for the Cods in the 2010/11 campaign.

Mullan, then joined Alfreton Town before his spell at Stalybridge.

The club is delighted to have captured a player of Jamie's calibre and will further enhance the squad in our quest to re-capture the Welsh Premier title.

The club have also announced that young winger, Jason Lampkin has been released by mutual consent and has joined Colwyn Bay.

Bangor City have signed highly-rated midfielder Danny Bell from Caernarfon Town.

The Bethel-born player is a Welsh U18 international who has also been on the books of Manchester United, Wrexham and, most recently, Oldham Athletic.
