AIRBUS UK BROUGHTON

THE Wingmakers returned to action on Saturday (June 6) when they hosted an Anglesey XI at the Hollingsworth Group Stadium. Airbus won 3-0 in what was a very useful workout.

It was the first step in preparation for the Europa League, with the draw to be made in Switzerland on June 22.

The visitors are preparing for the International Island Games, which will be held in Jersey starting on June 30.

Meanwhile, director of football Andy Preece admits Airbus landing a money-spinning Europa League tie with Premier League side West Ham would be 'massive' for the club.

The manager-less Hammers – who finished 12th in the league this season – will be in the first qualifying round draw with Preece's Wingmakers after topping England's fair play table,

And the Londoners are the side all three Welsh Premier League teams will be hoping to pull out of the hat.

"West Ham would be great for us, it'd be massive financially," Preece told the Chronicle.

"Wherever we played them you'd hope it'd be a sell-out and we'd love to test ourselves against top class players like they've got.

"Obviously we'd have a much better chance of beating a lesser team, but the kind of money drawing West Ham would generate for the club would be huge."

Financial prudence is still high on the agenda for Preece, who told the Chronicle he would not risk the Wingmakers' future by over-spending this summer.

Airbus did beat strong competition to bring in former Chester FC striker Tony Gray from AFC Telford United, but have seen first-team regulars Ryan Wade and Lewis Short depart, moving to Stalybridge Celtic and Nantwich Town respectively.

Preece does not anticipate further additions other than under-18s from the club's academy who will be handed senior contracts on the back of a treble-winning season. The 48-year-old said:

"Tony has been our major signing but two have gone out, and giving some of the young lads the opportunity to be part of the squad just shows we're planning for the long-term.

"We won't spend stupid money - it's too risky when you're trying to build a strong foundation.

"There's some major money being thrown about by a lot of sides in our league, but only three can qualify for Europe along with TNS so there'll be some disappointed clubs and backers come next May.

"Tony is on a good deal, don't get me wrong, but there are teams giving five, six, seven players the kind of money he's on. If we had a bottomless pit and we could afford to lose it I'd be spending big, but we haven't. It's not sustainable. We've got a similar budget to last year, so we can't go mental."

The Club can confirm that goalkeeper Terry McCormick has departed Deeside Stadium.

Terry has left The Club to join a number of former Nomads players at Flint Town United as our local neighbours – and once hosts – look to make the step up into the Welsh Premier League following their recently gained Domestic License.

Terry was named as the Goalkeeper of the year in the Dave Jones Daily Post Awards in December 2013, and in January 2014 was named in the official Welsh Premier League Team of Phase One.

Terry originally played for The Nomads between 2008 and 2010 before joining Bala Town and Conwy Borough before returning to Deeside Stadium.

On Terry's departure, Manager, Allan Bickerstaff said "Terry has been a great servant to The Club and has been a pleasure to deal with. He was instrumental in The Nomads reaching seventh place in the League last season and we wish him well with his new club."

Assistant Manager Jay Catton added "All the best to Terry – he's been a fantastic 'keeper and person at The Nomads - a great role model for our academy players."

The Nomads have signed 23 year old Nick Rushton. Rushton, the brother of former Nomads goalkeeper, John, joins the Deeside club on a two year deal. Nick came up through the youth ranks at Wrexham, before being loaned to Airbus UK, and Newtown, so brings strong Welsh Premier League experience with him. Nick experienced first team football at Wrexham in the 2012-13 season before joining Barrow on loan in September 2013. His spell at Holker Street was very successful, scoring ten goals in his loan spell, getting his loan spell extended and finishing the season as Barrow's top scorer with 16 goals.

This performance convinced Wrexham to offer Rushton a new one year contract extension, however found himself out of favour with Kevin Wilkin, and found himself loaned to Hednesford Town for the remainder of the 2014-15 season.

On Rushton's arrival, Manager Allan Bickerstaff said "Nick has been brought in to the club to score goals. He has a good record at each club that he has played for and I look forward to working with him."



The Nomads are pleased to announce the signing of 31-year-old goalkeeper John Danby.

Danby joins The Nomads from National League North side Bradford Park Avenue, where he spent the 2014-15 season making 32 appearances. Danby is perhaps best known for his time at Chester City, and the subsequent reformed Chester FC.

During his time at Chester City, he was voted the Player of the Season in the 2006-07 season and in the 2011-12 was awarded the Non-League goalkeeper of the season for Chester FC as the side won the Evo Stik Northern Premier League.

6'2" Danby also holds the Chester City club record for the most consecutive football league starts with 133 back-to-back appearances, and also has four years of experience with Kidderminster Harriers and a season at Eastwood Town.



On the move, Manager Allan Bickerstaff said "After being approached by a number of goalkeepers over the last few weeks, it was clear when I spoke to John that he was the man we needed at the Club. From our first conversation, he showed great desire and hunger to come to the Club and is ready for the challenge ahead of him.

John has a wealth of experience at a good level and comes into a squad that is as ambitious as he is, looking to be challenging in the top six of the Welsh Premier League next season."

Danby joins on a two year deal and along with the recent contract extensions of his ex-Chester teammates Kevin McIntyre and Danny Harrison, and George Horan, Sean Miller, Jay Crowther and Jack Riley all contracted for the 2015-16 season, things are looking positive at Deeside Stadium ahead of the new season.

Former Warrington Town striker Ashley Ruane has joined from Rhyl. The pacy front man scored 5 times from nine starts after joining the Lilywhites for phase two of last season's Welsh Premier, including one against the Nomads. Ashley featured in the Warrington FA Cup run last autumn.

Paul Linwood moves to Nomads from Salford City.

The Birkenhead born central defender started his career in the Football League with Tranmere Rovers and Chester City. Moves to Grimsby Town and Fleetwood Town followed before a return to Chester in 2012. Signed for Salford City during the summer of 2014 and captained Gary Neville's side. Paul is just the sort of dominant centre half that a successful Welsh Premier team needs and whilst at Chester formed a great partnership with our skipper George Horan.

NEWTOWN AFC

Newtown's players return to pre-season training on Saturday after just under three weeks off.

However boss Chris Hughes believes the players will be raring to go with a month left before the club's first European appearance for 17 years.

Hughes said: "The lads will have had just under three weeks off, but the momentum of that win in the play-off final will help.

"We will be looking to get the lads back working on Saturday and they should be in reasonable shape when they all return at the weekend. Then we have the first friendly at Airbus on Thursday to get the boys back into it.

"We have four tough tests which will be good for them before the European game in July then."

Hughes' side will face Airbus, Anglesey Games XI, Flint Town United and Bala before the Europa League

The Robins chief acted quickly to re-sign 12 of last season's squad, and other announcements are set to be made on the squad early next week.

No new faces have arrived at Latham Park yet, and Hughes insisted if players are to come in, they have to be the right fit for the club. He said: "Last year we brought in quite a lot of players early on but that won't be the case this year, because we have a good quality squad now. We will see what happens, but we have a good squad, and we have the 12 lads signed on already and there will be more to come. On transfers, we are looking at one or two, but they have to be the right player for Newtown Football Club and fit into our side."

The Bluebirds have signed striker Craig Moses from Goytre FC

He left Newtown on 14th May 2009 and signed for Llanelli AFC in June, having spent two seasons at Latham Park, playing at total of 51 (+7) times, scoring 18 times for the Robins.

After he was an unused substitute in the first leg, Moses made his Llanelli debut as an 80th minute sub for the Reds in the 2nd Leg against Motherwell in the Europa League at Parc Y Scarlets.

The youngster from Brecon had previously signed for the Robins on 18th June 2007 from Merthyr Tydfil, after Darren Ryan chased his signature for a number of months. The teenage striker progressed to the Welsh U18 squad and made his Merthyr first team debut against Mangotsfield United in the League cup. A month later he netted the winner on his full debut in the 1-0 league win over Banbury United.

Craig's superb season ended with international honours. In June, he played in all three Welsh U19 games at the Milk Cup tournament in Northern Ireland. Such was his contribution that Moses found himself on the bench for the Welsh U21 European qualifier versus Turkey at the start of September.

He won his first Wales U23 Semi Professional cap against Finland at Stebonheath Park in November 2009 and scored on his second cap against Poland at Carmarthen Town. He struck his second goal at that level, when he came on as a sub against N.Ireland in Portadown in November 2009.

He left Llanelli in 2013 when the club folded.
